Engage your child to do chores by assigning point values

A= weekly B=Daily C=2Xday D= monthly

Back Yard

- A - Sweep Patio & pick up (1.5)
- A - Trim Roses (1.5)
- C- Watering (2)
- A - Wash Down Furniture (2)
- One Time: Paint Furniture \$10

Finance

- D- Pay bills (3)
- D - Balance checkbook (3)

Front Yard

- A - Sweep porch and path to door (1.5)
- A- And remove cobwebs in front of house (1.5)
- A - Sweep garage and remove cobwebs (1.5)
- A- Clean garage windows inside and out (2)

Dogs

- C- Feed dog (0.25)
- D- Bath for dogs/brush (3)

In-Side

Kitchen

- A -Sweep & Mop Floor(2)
- D - Oil Cabinets(4)
- A- Clean Sink and Counter Tops(1)
- A- Oil Kitchen Table (2)

Laundry

- (1 load start to finish)
- B- Wash and dry cycles (2)
- B- Fold and put away (5)

Vacuum

- A-Vacuum upstairs (0.5)
- A- Vacuum Downstairs (0.5)
- A -Vacuum stairs (1)

Beds

- A- Make beds with new sheets (2)

Dusting

- A -Dust upstairs (4)
- A -Dust downstairs (2)
- A- Dust banister (2)

Groceries & Meals

- A -Shopping (2)
- A - Meal planning (2)
- A - Meal preparation and clean up (2)

Bathrooms

- A - Toilets (3)
- A - Sinks (1.5)
- A- Floors (2)
- A- Showers/Tubs (2)

Cars

- A- Wash outside Acura (1.5)
- A - Clean inside Acura (1.5)
- A- Wash outside Chevy (2)
- B- Clean inside Chevy (2)

Tips: Allow your children to choose their chores and train them on the chores they would like to learn how to do (age appropriate).

Give your child a certain total of points (s)he must earn based upon the tasks chosen.

Then set allowance on a budget that makes sense for your child's age, what you can afford, and what financial lessons you want to instill.
